# Project 4: Color Composition

### Critique and Due: December 6

# Project:

Recreate a composition you created for the first project (Line Dynamics) or the abstract steps 5 or 6 of second project (Line Abstraction) using colors found in two master paintings of your choice.

### **Objectives:**

- To gain experience in the use color mixing and application of color theory
- To gain experience in judging relative value
- To make decisions of relative value and shape based on the totality of form and composition
- To translate detail into larger shapes
- Understanding of essential forms of composition and design principles

# Materials:

- 11"x14" Bristol board, use proportions of original image
- Tempera paint and brushes
- Color images of master's work to work from (3)
- Rubber Cement/Rubber Cement Pick up
- Ruler
- Pencil/Eraser
- Exacto knife and cutting surface

### Size:

As large as possible up to 11" x14" but keeping with the original image proportions

### Method:

- 1. Find three paintings from masters that excel in color and print it out in color on 8.5" x 11" paper.
- 2. Paint swatches of 30 hues found in the paintings as reference. These do not have to be large. 1"x2" enough.
- 3. Choose the layout you will recreate in color and transfer it to Bristol using diluted light yellow paint to mark where items go.
- 4. Starting with the background, fill in the larger shapes. Note: go over the edges a little bit so that the white does not show on the sides.
- 5. Then work on the smaller shapes finishing with detail.

### Evaluation will be based on the following:

- Process work: photocopy of works considered for study and sketches
- Color harmony and shape relationships pertaining to composition.
- Design principles and project objectives
- Presentation: even cutting, gluing, measuring
